



Denise Hibbert: Nurse Inducted as HON-Fellow American Society of Colon and Rectal Surgeons (HON-FASCRS) 2024


As a nurse, and especially as a practicing Ostomy and Colorectal Nurse Specialist working in Saudi Arabia, I was delighted to hear of Denise Hibbert's nomination as an Honorary Fellow of the American Society of Colon and Rectal Surgeons (ASCRS).

The ASCRS recognises a maximum of six Honorary Fellows annually, for their "outstanding achievements and contributions to the field of colon and rectal surgery and allied fields". They must have contributed to the "peer reviewed literature, advanced and/or fostered innovation, and education in the specialty of colon and rectal surgery or allied fields" they must have "demonstrated significant and/or sustained leadership within their country" "developed and promulgated significant advances (clinical, research and/or technological)" (https://fascrs.org/news/meetthe-2024-honorary-fellows).

I have known and worked with Denise for more than 10 years, as my coach, mentor and friend I believe this is well deserved. She has spent over 35 years in the care of individuals with colorectal conditions with over 20 years as a Specialist Nurse and later an Advanced Practice Nurse (APN) and Nursing Director. She was also Director of a National Education Program to train Nurses in Ostomy, Wound and Continence (OWC) and was Senior Lecturer at Al Faisal University, where she taught on the surgical program for medical students. Having set up services for wounds and ostomies she spent several years in nurse-led clinics caring for individuals with bowel and anorectal dysfunction, where she was involved in starting the first anorectal physiology and pelvic floor unit in Saudi Arabia, teaching both Enterostomal Therapist and Colorectal Surgical Fellows. There are now several centers in Saudi Arabia and other GCC countries. Denise was a founding member of both the Saudi Colorectal Surgical Society and its Chapter of Enterostomal Therapy. As Director for colorectal services at a large tertiary referral center Denise was also instrumental in developing services around patientcentered care, including a registry for individuals with familial adenomatous polyposis (FAP) and hereditary colorectal cancers; tumour board coordination for cancer patients, and services to provide education, counseling and support for individuals with chronic and complex colorectal conditions, such as inflammatory bowel disease and colorectal cancer. She has also pushed the agenda on APN in Saudi Arabia, the Princess Nourah bint Abdulrahman University (PNU) is now training its 7th Cohort of ANP. She has 18 publications related to APN, OWC and colorectal conditions and developing

services. Denise has also undertaken research and coached and mentored others in research and writing for publication. She is currently on the editorial boards of the Annals of Saudi Medicine, the Journal of the World Council of Enterostomal Therapists®, the World Journal of Colorectal Surgery, the Advances in Skin and Wound Care Journal, and the International Wound Journal. She is also the past Education Chair and current President Elect of the WCET®.

Denise was officially awarded this honour at the annual meeting of the ASCRS in June at their 125th anniversary scientific meeting in Baltimore, USA. This again demonstrates the mutual professional respect and comradery that OWC Nurses and Colorectal Surgeons have, and how important it is to recognise those collaborations towards excellence in patient care.

Convexity isn't new




Fig. 7. Marlen Manufacturing Company appliances.

In 1961 Dr Rupert Turnbull wrote an articleforthe Cleveland Clinic Journal of Medicine entitled 'Instructions to the Ileostomy Patient; Management of the Stoma'. In that article he refers to pouches with convexity and plastic convex inserts, even flexible convexity (labeled Figure 7 below). 

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



SOBEST® created the first Choosing Wisely® recommendations on localised infection in

difficult-to-heal wounds





SOBEST® created the first Choosing Wisely® recommendations for localised infection in difficult-to-heal wounds. This material is a first for nursing in Brazil and a first for the association of enterostomal therapists. The material follows international Choosing Wisely® standards and consists of cards to be used as teaching/ learning instruments in health institutions. The cards are available through a link or QR CODE, on the SOBEST® website and the Choosing Wisely Brazil website and can be printed. SOBEST's® recommendations were made in partnership with Choosing Wisely® Brazil and coordinated by myself, Dr Sônia Regina Pérez Evangelista Dantas, and Dr Juliano Teixeira Moraes and the recommendations on infections located in difficult-to-heal wounds were drawn from the results of a Master's thesis by Leticia Maria de Oliveira. The recommendations are available in Portuguese, English and Spanish.

The goal of the American Board of Internal Medicine (ABIM) Foundation's Choosing Wisely® campaign was to spark conversations between health care professionals and patients about what tests, treatments, and procedures are needed, and which ones are not.

It began in 2012 with nine national specialty societies (representing 375,000 clinicians) offering 45 examples of tests or treatments that were commonly used in their fields but lacked strong supporting evidence. Between 2012 and 2023, more than 80 specialty societies highlighted additional examples. While these examples are no longer maintained and available on the website, specialty societies are encouraged to publish individual lists.


The Choosing Wisely® campaign was created to minimise waste in healthcare, by structuring recommendations based on evidence, of what SHOULD NOT BE DONE as it is not proven effective and therefore represents waste.

Chilean Report: Commemorating International Norma N. Gill Day®

The event was to raise awareness among professionals about the importance of specialised care for persons with an ostomy and understanding of the development of stoma therapy and societies in the World, including Latin America, Brazil and Chile. This day included the participation of distinguished speakers: Laurent Chabal and Denise Hibbert (President and President Elect WCET®) and Dr Sonia Dantes (President of SOBEST®), who sent their greetings for the development of this initiative, in addition to sharing a little history.

From Valdivia: Andrea Lira

In Valdivia, nurse Andrea Lira works in a private clinic where she sees the different realities of her patients. Their quality of life is affected due to a lack of education after surgery or discharge, regarding stoma management. Many patients are forced to learn management of their stoma alone, delaying ostomy acceptance and their reintegration into a normal life. Along with other professionals, she leads activities focused on colon and rectal cancer prevention in her institution and community with a multidisciplinary approach, generating instances of continuing education and support for the patients and their families. Her dream is to be able to form a group of ostomy patients in the South of Chile.

From Santiago Bárbara Baeza

Barbara is a nurse who works in Santiago in a public pediatric hospital, the Roberto del Río Hospital, which has a comprehensive children's rehabilitation service, focused on the care of children with a high degree of medical complexity who require early and timely rehabilitation in various areas. Barbara is the head nurse of the team of nurses with whom she creates a polyclinic for the management of ostomised patients where she meets paediatric patients requiring specialised care for complex stomas. Types of stomas cared for are tracheostomies, esophagostomies, gastrostomies, ileostomies, and colostomies. Running this unit involves administrative management, education, purchasing of supplies, and professional training, among others. This unit has made it possible to reduce complications and favor home management, helping adolescents to

accept and care for their stomas, improving their quality of life. Patients are seen preoperatively and followed after discharge. This is one of the pioneer units in pediatrics.

From Castro Chiloé: Carolina Pino

Carola Pino is the nurse in charge of patients with ostomies at the Castro Hospital, located on the island of Chiloé, where she is responsible for monitoring and caring for a population of 80 ostomy patients. At this site, a training day was organised that incorporated ET nurse specialists, nurses and surgeons, tools were delivered for complications and stoma site marking among others.

From Temuco: Verónica García Silva

Verónica García Silva is head nurse of the surgery and trauma service at the Temuco hospital, it has 700 beds, and is a highly complex hospital. Her motivation to provide specialised care for children with anorectal malformation dates back to 12 years, when her daughter was born with anorectal malformation, she realised

that these children were helpless without the existence of programs of specialised care. There were also no laws that ensured comprehensive care or support for these children. There was also no specialised nursing care. Together with urological surgeon Dr Mario Varela Guzmán, she started a movement to help families.

Deeply motivated by the reality that she had to live, she fought tirelessly to generate changes, and obtain both professional and material support. She managed to obtain legal representation and created a comprehensive care program for these children, a lot of work but great satisfaction. The support is given both pre and post-operatively, until the closure of the stoma.

There is not a physical site to care for patients, although it has a population of 80 children with 10 new cases a year. The children receive education and follow-up until the bowel continuity is re-established.

In 2023, the nurse in charge of the ostomy patient care program decided to realise a dream that would benefit a large number of patients, this was to unite her patients to receive support, and education and create spaces for integration. In June of that year, the first meeting was held, subsequently, the first board of directors was formed, and it became a legal group, being able to participate in local, municipal, and national meetings. Currently we are more than 70 people, including patients, family members and nurses, united to fight for the rights of people with ostomies: such as having specialised care, quality supplies delivered to every person with an ostomy, and above all, achieving greater visibility and recognition.

From Santiago UC-Christus Hospital: Report by Ximena Meneses

A team of coloproctology nurses from the UC-Christus Health Network in Santiago de Chile, Ximena Meneses, Ana María Rodríguez and Ignacia Valdés, carried out training in the area of coloproctology for different teams of professionals: specialist nurses, clinical nurses and doctors in training. A total of 94 clinical nurses were educated about the impact of the ostomy, proper care, devices, and screening for complications. In the same context, 17 surgical residents, a research nurse and two research fellows from the Faculty of Medicine of the Catholic University, were trained on marking the stoma site, complications and supplies.

International Council of Nurses (ICN) congratulates graduates of its latest Leadership for Change Programme, held in Bangladesh

Geneva, Switzerland, June 11th, 2024: Nearly 100 nurses in Bangladesh have recently completed the International Council of Nurses Leadership for Change (LFC) programme. The 96 participants, working in four cohorts, have undertaken a series of workshops and have been working on projects designed to make a real difference to leadership in nursing in the health services where they work.

The 20 projects undertaken by the participants are aimed at increasing workplace safety for nurses, improving nurses' work environments, strengthening the safety and quality of healthcare services, and enhancing effective communication within the nursing team and with patients and their families. Since completing, 21 of the graduates have been selected to undergo the LFC Training of Trainers programme, who will be helping to secure the future of LFC in Bangladesh.

ICN chief executive Howard Catton said: "The only way to achieve strong and effective health systems is to have strong nurse leaders involved at all the key critical decision-making points in the system. Nurse leaders know and understand people's needs and how to make the right decisions to deliver the best health care and achieve the most positive health outcomes. If nursing is not represented throughout the health system, we are flying blind. ICN is proud to continue its longstanding work to grow nursing leadership capacity, and I want to express my congratulations and gratitude to the nurses in Bangladesh who have completed their LFC programme. I am sure they are already making a difference to their colleagues and the patients they serve. Having a cohort of new trainers is also incredibly welcome because it will mean that they can pass on their knowledge and experience to other nurses right across Bangladesh. I am sure that soon we will see the benefits of improved nursing leadership in the form of better health outcomes for the people of Bangladesh."

LFC programme director Dr Kristine Qureshi said: "We expect that these ICN LFC programme graduates will now go forward and lead change to improve the quality of care for their patients, as well as the workplace environment for their fellow healthcare workers. The 21 new LFC trainers in Bangladesh have been well prepared to provide LFC training to other nurses across the country. This training of trainers approach serves as a multiplier for increasing the impact of the LFC programme nationwide."

ICN is grateful for the support of the local partner organisation, ProNurse Project, which aims to improve the quality of gender-responsive education and enhance the professional status of nurses in Bangladesh.

The LFC Bangladesh programme was made possible with the generous financial assistance of Global Affairs Canada and Cowater International. ICN intends to establish a two-year LFC License Agreement with Cowater to enable it to implement LFC through till 2026.

Cowater Project Director Lubana Ahmed said: "Cowater is committed to the empowerment of women and believes strongly in the transformative power of locally driven change. We have witnessed in the past decade the positive changes nurses bring to patients, systems and communities in Bangladesh. ProNurse has supported these nurse leaders, who are now carrying out projects to effect changes in nursing education and patient care."

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
